What academic writing key features should you take into account to make your final written product (master dissertation) fit the research requirements?

## A. The composition should identify these assumptions:

- The main objective of academic writing is clear communication. This can be presented by presenting ideas in an orderly and concise manner.
- Establishing an appropriate tone, clear, and precise word choice and sentence structure can contribute into the realisation of impactful work.
- To achieve this, academic writing key features need to be taken into consideration; these mainly concern (1) conciseness, (2) clarity, (3) flow and continuity, (4) formal language, and (5) general rules of grammar and usage.

## B. The evaluation of the composition takes into account the quality of writing. This concerns:

- Coherence and cohesion.
- Sentence structure.
- Clarity and conciseness of sentences/ideas.
- Spelling.
- Punctuation and mechanics.
