What: used for thing (subjective/ objective case) - What do you do? **This:** pointing a near person or a near thing in distance or time. (for singular) Which: used for thing (subjective/ objective These: pointing a near set of things or case) - Which book are you reading? persons in distance or time. (for plural) Who: used for person (subjective case) - Who is knocking at the door? **That:** pointing a far person or a far thing in distance or time. (for singular) Whom: used for person (objective case) - Whom did they invite? **Those:** pointing a far set of things or persons Whose: used for person (possessive case) in distance or time.
