

The Almohad Caliphate

The Almohad Caliphate was an Islamic state founded by the Almohads, who are of the Almohad dynasty. It was established in the twelfth century. It ruled the countries of Morocco and Andalusia for the years 1121 AD - 1269 AD. It was founded by Muhammad bin Tumart. Its capital was Marrakesh.

the Almohad state in Morocco

the Almohad state, or the state of the Almohads, arose in the sixth century AH, and that was at the hands of a person known as Ibn Tumart, who is Muhammad bin Abdullah bin Sayyid bin Mansur, whom many called (Abu Mahdi). and it was dominated by two men of knowledge, namely Abu Muhammad Abdallah bin Mahasin al-Mansuri and Abd al-Mu'min bin Ali al-Tajri al-Kumi al-Purwsi. It is worth noting that Ibn Tumart worked hard in studying language and religion in European countries and the East, and an Islamic religious movement was mounted that basically aimed at establishing an Islamic caliphate that would return the Islamic nation to the era of the Rightly Guided Caliphs - focusing on the principle of pure monotheism. Hence the name of state (Almohads), and the name of the supporters in his call by a large number of followers, which enabled him to lead a great revolution, through which he was able to call for the seizure of assets, and eliminate the branches as he established his government in the Maghreb.

From Tumurt continued to mobilize the supporters and supporters of his call to unite the allegiance of the Moroccan nation to him, take over the mandate in year 516 AH, after he was able to eliminate the Almoravid state in Al-Andalus Morocco.

3 Systems in the state of the Almoechads

like other states, the Almoechad state included several regimes during its prosperity, as it had a political system

* political system = the caliph is the head of the state and is called the Commander of the faithful or the Imam, the caliphs succeeded in ruling the Almoechad state

* Administrative system - the administrative system in the Almoechad state was distinguished by the presence of a number of ministers who carried out the orders of the caliph. It also included a number of writers whose mission was to assist the caliph in managing the affairs of the country. It also included several other positions, including the bailli, policemen, etc.

* the judicial system.

the Almohad state included a strong and judicial system where judges are appointed by order of the caliph, and the judicial system was divided into halves, the group judge, ~~which~~ is the city judge is the one who rules in.

* military regime -

the Almohad state included a military regime and a ~~large~~ army that was able to maintain the security of the state and the command of the army in the hands of the sons of the caliph or the sheikhs or their sons.

The Fall of the Almohad state:

like other states, the Almohad state was subjected to many reasons that paved the way for its downfall

- Excessive bloodshed: the Almohad state killed thousands of Almoravids, and underestimated in bloodshed.
- deviation from the faith = the Almohads introduced concept bel that contradict Islamic law, the most dangerous of which is the infidelity of the Almoravid state, and its permissibility kill its members.
- internal revolutions: the repeated internal revolutions that took place within the Almohad state contributed to its downfall, among the most famous of the Ghanaian revolt
- . the opening of the Almohad state: Money increased in the hands of the Almohads, and they opened themselves up to the war very much, which led to their deviation from their primary goal
- . Bad living = the ill-wishers that became stronger at that time played a major role in the weakness of the Almohad state in addition to the neglect of the Almohad rulers of the principle of shura, on which it was based.
