THE 13 ENGLISH COLONIES OF NORTH AMERICA

Virginia

It was established in 1607 by the Virginia Company of London. It was led by figures such as John Smith and John Rolfe. Virginia developed primarily through tobacco cultivation and the **labor of indentured servants and later enslaved Africans.**

Massachusetts

It was established by the Pilgrims in 1620 and the Massachusetts Bay Company in 1630. It was led by figures such as John Winthrop and Roger Williams. **Massachusetts Colony** developed as a **Puritan society** with an emphasis on religion, agriculture, trade, and shipbuilding.

New Hampshire

Originally part of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, it became a separate colony in **1679**. It developed as a fishing, trading, and agricultural colony.

Maryland

It was established by **George Calvert**, also known as **Lord Baltimore**, in 1632. It developed as a proprietary colony with **religious tolerance**, tobacco cultivation, and trade.

Connecticut

It was settled by **Thomas Hooker** and others in the 1630s. It developed as a charter colony with a focus on agriculture, trade, and manufacturing.

Rhode Island

It was founded by **Roger Williams** in 1636 and **Anne Hutchinson** in 1638. It developed as a haven for **religious dissenters** and emphasized religious freedom, trade, and maritime activities.

New York

It was originally settled by the **Dutch** and it was named **New Amsterdam**. It was **captured by the English in 1664.** It was led by figures such as Peter Stuyvesant and the Duke of York (later King James II). **It eveloped as a royal colony with a diverse population engaged in trade, agriculture, and commerce**.

New Jersey

It was originally settled by the **Dutch and Swedes**. It became an English colony in **1664.** It developed as a proprietary colony with a focus on agriculture, trade, and commerce.

Pennsylvania

It was founded by **William Penn in 1681** as a refuge for Quakers and others seeking religious freedom. It developed as a **proprietary colony with religious tolerance**, agriculture, trade, and industry.

Delaware

It was originally part of Pennsylvania, it became a separate colony in <u>1704</u>. It developed as a proprietary colony with agriculture, trade, and industry.

North Carolina

It was originally settled by English colonists from Virginia in the 1650s. It developed as a royal colony with a focus on agriculture, particularly tobacco, and trade.

South Carolina

It was founded in **1670 by English colonists who came from Barbados (in the Caribbean)**. It developed as a royal colony with a plantation economy based on rice and indigo cultivation, as well as trade.

Georgia

It was established by **James Oglethorpe** in **1733** as a refuge for debtors and a buffer against Spanish Florida. It developed as a royal colony with an emphasis on agriculture, trade, and military defense.
